Even people who support Ron Paul's Presidential candidacy are considered domestic terrorists and feared by the elites, who work overtime in back rooms in order to ensure Paul's message of liberty is contained.

We now have a President who has determined he can be [the sole judge and jury](#) and decide who should be executed. Congress says little and does nothing and is, therefore, complicit. This effectively annulled the 5th, 6th and 8th Amendments.

- A report issued on Tuesday by Ammoland Shooting Sports News indicates that the ATF--the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives--is engaged in new illegal activity, this time in the state of Alaska.
- According to gun store owners in Anchorage, ATF agents are requiring that they submit what is called '4473 Forms' going as far back as 2007.
-
- Form 4473 is the official form that gun stores require customers to complete when they purchase a firearm. It is not intended to be a gun registration form but a sales record containing information on who bought the firearm, a photo I.D., and the official background check. The store owner then records this data in what is called 'the bound-book,' which is kept in perpetuity by the gun store and submitted to the ATF if the shop goes out of business.

The ATF has the authority to inspect or request a copy of the form *if agents are conducting a criminal investigation*. But nowhere does the law or the rules and regulations of the ATF permit the agency to require gun stores to simply turn over these records en masse as a matter of course.

The gun stores in Anchorage are not being told that their records are being requested as part of a criminal investigation of any kind. The ATF has not specified certain forms from specific time frames as one would expect during such an investigation. The agency is telling the stores that it wants *all* of these records, *in totality*, going back to 2007.

Eagle Firearms does a good job at explaining what the law concerning Form 4473 entails:

Here's some things to note about Form 4473. This form is not sent to any government agency, it's actually kept on file by the local dealer. While this form contains the make/model/serial # of the weapon, plus all your personal information, it is not mailed out anywhere. The dealer will use this form to run your background check via the FBI NICS system.. However, the background check does not contain any of the following information: A) what you bought or its serial # (only if it was a long-gun or handgun) and B) whether you actually purchased the firearm and left with it. As far as the Federal government knows a background check was run on you and that's about it. They don't have any record of what you did or did not purchase.

The only way the feds really ever see that data is in the event of a weapon being used in a crime.

Thus, Form 4473 is not intended to be used by any government agency as a form of registration. Yet this is precisely what the ATF is doing in Anchorage, and the gun stores are crying foul.

Ammoland is telling gun dealers throughout Alaska that they are within their legal rights to refuse to turn over the records to the ATF.

The ATF is already facing a Congressional investigation into its illegal activity in the Fast and Furious scandal, during which the agency placed thousands of U.S. guns into the hands of Mexican drug cartels for the specific purpose of creating false statistics showing that most of the firearms used by Mexican criminals come from the United States. The Obama Administration would then use the false statistics to make a case for new gun bans and massive new gun control laws, according to the whistleblower agents who first reported the scheme in late 2010.

Curiously, the agency is also under fire for using intimidation tactics on various gun store owners throughout the Rocky Mountain and Western states, Idaho and Arizona in particular. The agency has also been shown to intimidate gun owners themselves, attempting to use firearms retailers as spies and making visits directly to the homes of citizens who purchase guns.

Rural kids, parents angry about Labor Dept. rule banning farm chores

Update, April 26, 7:55 p.m.: Citing public outrage, the Department of Labor has withdrawn the controversial rulemaking proposal described in this article.

A proposal from the Obama administration to prevent children from doing farm chores has drawn plenty of criticism from rural-district members of Congress. But now it's attracting barbs from farm kids themselves. The Department of Labor is poised to put the finishing touches on a rule that would apply child labor laws to children working on family farms, prohibiting them from performing a list of jobs on their own families' land. Under the rules, most children under 18 could no longer work "in the storing, marketing and transporting of farm product raw materials."

"Prohibited places of employment," a Department press release read, "would include country grain elevators, grain bins, silos, feed lots, stockyards, livestock exchanges and livestock auctions."

The new regulations, first proposed August 31 by Labor Secretary Hilda Solis, would also revoke the government's approval of safety training and certification taught by independent groups like 4-H and FFA, replacing them instead with a 90-hour federal government training course.

Rossie Blinson, a 21-year-old college student from Buis Creek, N.C., told The Daily Caller that the federal government's plan will do far more harm than good.

"The main concern I have is that it would prevent kids from doing 4-H and FFA projects if they're not at their parents' house," said Blinson.

"I started showing sheep when I was four years old. I started with cattle around 8. It's been very important. I learned a lot of responsibility being a farm kid."

In Kansas, Cherokee County Farm Bureau president Jeff Clark was out in the field — literally on a tractor — when TheDC reached him. He said if Solis's regulations are implemented, farming families' labor losses from their children will only be part of the problem.

"What would be more of a blow," he said, "is not teaching our kids the values of working on a farm."

The Environmental Protection Agency reports that the average age of the American farmer is now over 50.

"Losing that work ethic — it's so hard to pick this up later in life," Clark said. "There's other ways to learn how to farm, but it's so hard. You can learn so much more working on the farm when you're 12, 13, 14 years old."

John Weber, 19, understands. The Minneapolis native grew up in suburbia and learned the livestock business working summers on his relatives' farm. He's now a college Agriculture major.

"I started working on my grandparent's and uncle's farms for a couple of weeks in the summer when I was 12," Weber told TheDC. "I started spending full summers there when I was 13."

"The work ethic is a huge part of it. It gave me a lot of direction and opportunity in my life. If they do this it will

prevent a lot of interest in agriculture. It's harder to get a 16 year-old interested in farming than a 12 year old."

Weber is also a small businessman. In high school, he said, he took out a loan and bought a few steers to raise for income. "Under these regulations," he explained, "I wouldn't be allowed to do that."

In February the Labor Department seemingly backed away from what many had called an unrealistic reach into farmers' families, reopening the public comment period on a section of the regulations designed to give parents an exemption for their own children.

But U.S. farmers' largest trade group is unimpressed.

"American Farm Bureau does not view that as a victory," said Kristi Boswell, a labor specialist with the American Farm Bureau Federation. "It's a misconception that they have backed off on the parental exemption."

That narrow "parental exception" has quickly become a political football in U.S. agriculture. The Farm Bureau and one other national agricultural group told TheDC that it would only apply to parents who "wholly own" their own farms.

That would rule out kids working on an uncle's farm, or a grandfather's, and it would ban teens from working on farms where ownership is split — even among several generations of the same family. It would also mean teens couldn't be around when their friends are doing farm work.

Estimates vary on the number of children who live on farms their parents "wholly own." One state-level Farm Bureau cited an internal estimate of less than 30 percent. That number, the organization said, takes into account the fact that many farms in animal agriculture are part-owned by the large food companies that ultimately purchase the meat after slaughter.

More than 10,000 letters and emails poured in when the regulation was opened up for public comment in late 2011. Boswell's objection stems from Labor Secretary Solis' decision to give the public a second chance to weigh in after the first round of public opinion was decidedly in favor of letting kids participate fully in agriculture.

Boswell also chafed at the government's rationale — injury rates — for bringing farms strictly into line with child labor laws.

"They have said the number of injuries are higher for children than in non-ag industries," she said. But everyone in agriculture, Boswell insisted, "makes sure youth work in tasks that are age-appropriate."

The safety training requirements strike many in agriculture as particularly strange, given an injury rate among young people that is already falling rapidly.

According to a United States Department of Agriculture study, farm accidents among youth fell nearly 40 percent between 2001 and 2009, to 7.2 injuries per 1,000 farms.

Clark said the regulations are vague and meddlesome.

"It's so far-reaching," he exclaimed, "kids would be prohibited from working on anything 'power take-off' driven, and anything with a work-height over six feet — which would include the tractor I'm on now."

The way the regulations are currently written, he added, would prohibit children under 16 from using battery powered screwdrivers, since their motors, like those of a tractor, are defined as "power take-off driven."

And jobs that could "inflict pain on an animal" would also be off-limits for kids. But "inflicting pain," Clark explained, is left undefined: If it included something like putting a halter on a steer, 4-H and FFA animal shows would be a thing of the past.

In a letter to The Department of Labor in December, Montana Republican Rep. Denny Rehberg complained that the animal provision would also mean young people couldn't "see veterinary medicine in practice ... including a veterinarian's own children accompanying him or her to a farm or ranch."

Boswell told TheDC that the new farming regulations could be finalized as early as August. She claimed farmers could soon find The Labor Department's Wage and Hour Division inspectors on their land, citing them for violations. "In the last three years that division has grown 30 to 40 percent," Boswell said. Some Farm Bureau members, she added, have had inspectors on their land checking on conditions for migrant workers, only to be cited for allowing their own children to perform chores that the Labor Department didn't think were age-appropriate.

It's something Kansas Republican Senator Jerry Moran believes simply shouldn't happen. During a March 14 hearing, Moran blasted Hilda Solis for getting between rural parents and their children. "The consequences of the things that you put in your regulations lack common sense," Moran said. "And in my view, if the federal government can regulate the kind of relationship between parents and their children on their own family's farm, there is almost nothing off-limits in which we see the federal government intruding in a way of life."

The Department of Labor did not respond to repeated requests for comment.

This article was updated after publication to clarify the Department of Labor's proposed rules related to the narrow "parental exception." The update comprises the first four paragraphs, above, on page 2 of the article.



Excerpt from *Government Bonds and Bondage*

VOTE "NO" ON MUNICIPAL BONDS

With respect to general political principle, no one should ever vote for the issuing of new bonds. This is always an attempt by local politicians to increase the amount of money they have to spend, spend, spend on boondoggles and good old boy deals. There is no aspect of local government that is more corrupt than the issuing of bonds for general obligations or even specific obligations. This is the way that local politicians pay off their constituents who have real money, and who contribute to campaigns. One group of investors, meaning distant bond investors, are expropriated over the long term, while other constituents, meaning the local good old boy network, profits as a result of this expropriation.

The voters are then put on the hook to repay the bonds. The higher the bond indebtedness, the more that local taxpayers must repay the original investors. If inflation does not wipe out the obligation, then taxpayers are going to see taxes rise on their property, or see local sales taxes increased.

Because property taxes are the basis of county government, people cannot hide the taxable asset. The government knows who owns the property, and the government can extract payments from the voters until such time as there is a voter rebellion. Because voters pay very little attention to county government, they do not understand that the constant issuing of new bond indebtedness is the basis of their loss of liberty at the local level.

This is why any conservative political movement should have as its number-one goal, locally, the blocking of every bond authorization election. They must do whatever is necessary to alert voters to the costs of paying off those bonds, and the power of the voters to stop the expansion of local government and stop the expansion of rising property taxes by means of politics.

Local politics should focus on strangling local government expenditures. The best way to do this is to make certain that every bond authorization that comes before the voters is defeated. If the good old boys locally cannot raise money by means of bond sales, they will have to do it by direct taxation, and this creates political resistance.

The expert here is conservative activist [Paul Dorr](#). He trains people in the techniques of defeating municipal bond elections. Let us hope that others adopt his techniques and sell their services.

Americans are so convinced that long-term debt is a good idea that they find it difficult to organize politically against bond issues locally. They vote for the bonds, because they think it is essentially free money. They are present-oriented, and they do not factor in the effects of increased bond indebtedness on local property values and local business.

This is the heart of the matter. The voters, who legally control the issuing of bonds, are present-oriented, which means that they discount sharply the costs of paying off the bonds in the future. On the other hand, investors in bonds are future-oriented, and they see the advantage of getting a future stream of income without any risk on their part, or so

they think. They assume that the risk is minimal, because they assume there will be no mass inflation, and they assume that there will be no taxpayer revolt. They assume that the pension obligations of the cities and counties will not force either the bankruptcy of these jurisdictions or else force a default on the bonds. It is much less risky politically to default on bonds owned by distant investors than it is to raise taxes on local taxpayers.

CONCLUSION

There is going to come a day when the defaults begin, and people who have turned their money over to the government will rue the day they ever trusted the government. The politicians know that bond investors have short memories, and that they will come right back with their money to do it again. We have learned that repeatedly over the past 400 years. Investors in Latin American bonds have learned this every generation for over two centuries. Slow learners wind up big losers.

When governments resort to inflation to stimulate the economy, they ultimately undermine the hopes and dreams of bond investors. But there are not many bond investors, so governments really do not worry very much about undermining their dreams.

I hope this cycle can be broken. If the great default is great enough, maybe it will be.
